I just returned from a very busy Legislative Conference in Washington DC. I attended the National Council of Administration Workshop on Sunday, Budget & Finance Committee Meeting, National Council of Administration Meeting and Parade of Winners on Monday, visited Congressmen & Staff on Capital Hill Tuesday, and Commander-in-Chief's Testimony to the House & Senate Armed Services Committee on Wednesday.

I want to now write entirely about a specific topic that occurred while I was representing you.

On Saturday, March 1st, I attended a National Council of Administration Workshop. One of the many items on the agenda was a "Voice of Democracy Proposal" which was to eliminate the Washington DC VFW Voice of Democracy Winner's Field Trip. I want to tell you the exact wording of this proposal that I was given to me at the workshop. So here it is in italic print. Please read it carefully!

VOICE OF DEMOCRACY PROPOSAL

Recommendation for VFW National to fund the Spirit of America Leadership seminar attendance Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. Eliminate the Departments expense to send Voice of Democracy winners which on average save the Departments \$1500. Purpose of trip is a four-day conference for high school students to interact with experts on citizenship, democracy, the free enterprise system, the judicial system, and the American political process. The program includes thought-provoking lectures, historical tours, and experimental workshops, all designed to develop leadership skills and deepen an understanding of the rights and

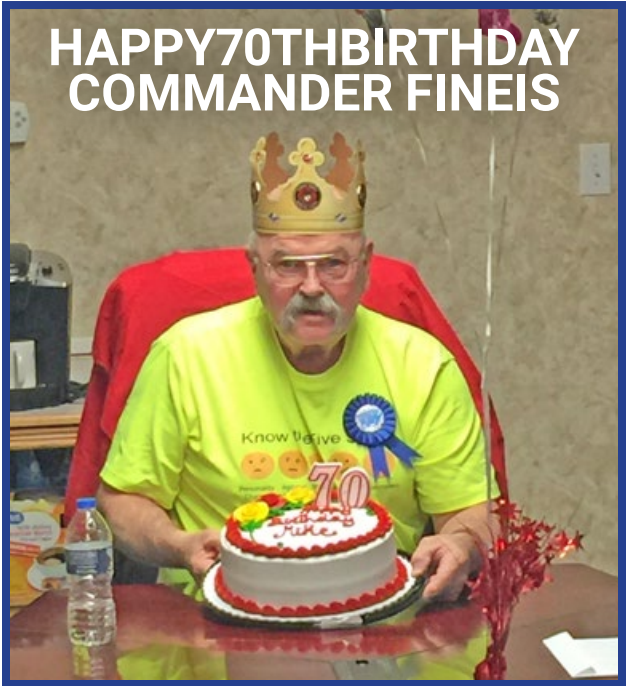

responsibilities of engaged citizenship. Tuition for 53 students is \$26,500 will travel approximately \$29k leading to a total expense at \$55,500.

Recommendation to eliminate the Washington DC VFW Voice of Democracy's winner's field trip. VOD winner's field trip is budgeted for a \$130k expense. This trip is purely an experimental trip with the awarding of scholarships and sight-seeing of the Washington DC memorials and museums. The VFW Legislative conference has an expense of nearly \$40k of stipends for Department commanders along with an additional \$35k in transportation costs to attend to escort the VOD winners in the parade of Winners. The stage and production costs are \$27k to host the parade of winners. Total expense to VFW is \$232k.

Recommendation to bring the top 5 place finishers of the Voice of Democracy and national 1st place Patriots Pen to the National Convention for a Mini Parade of Winners in which the announcement of their placement will be officially announced to the Convention. The Department commander for the winners' year will escort to the stage and announced to joint session and live streamed. Each winner will be authorized a (1) parent to escort. The winner will be provided 2-night hotel accommodation and per diem at the approved GSA rate. Cost approx. \$35k.

So, I hope you read it carefully and are disturbed or upset, like I was and still am, when I first heard about it. Kevin Jones stated that Senior Vice Commander-in-Chief Harold J. "Hal" Roesch, II, Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief Matthew M. "Fritz" Mihelcic and the Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief Designee decided together on the Voice of Democracy Proposal and not Commander-in-Chief William J. "Doc" Schmitz and not Adjutant General Kevin Jones.

Everything is about money. National is saying it costs too much to put on the Voice of Democracy and National Patriots Pen Winners Trip to Washington DC. National wants reduce the costs by giving an alternative four-day trip to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. Well, Washington DC is where our Nation's Capital is located. The business of our Country is conducted in Washington DC. The White House is in Washington DC. There is so much HISTORY in Washington DC.

Here are some of the places in March 2018 that the (52) Voice of Democracy Winners and the National Patriots Pen Winner visited in Washington DC with me, when I was appointed Chairman of the VFW Programs Committee, Mount Vernon, Holocaust Museum, International Spy Museum, Jefferson Memorial, Martin Luther King Memorial, US Capitol, Iwo Jima Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery including seeing the Laying of Wreaths, Changing of the Guard and visiting John Kennedy's Grave. Also visiting the Newseum, White House Tour, Smithsonian

Museum, National Archives, American History Museum, National History Museum, Air & Space Museum, American Indian Museum and National Gallery of Art to name a few. Also, the Vietnam Wall, Korean War Memorial, World War II Memorial and the Lincoln Memorial. On the evening of the last day, the students went on a riverboat cruise on the Potomac River.

Now, where do you think our students will learn more about the history of the United States? These students will remember the Washington DC trip & their new friends for the rest of their lives. They got to see things in our Nation's Capital, Washington DC, that most high school students and most middle school students could not afford to.

At this National C of A meeting, Adjutant General Kevin Jones brought up the Voice of Democracy Proposal. When the motion was made and seconded, I got up immediately and spoke against it with the 10 bullet points I prepared and NO other National Council member got up after me! Next, Florida rep., Benny Bachand, motioned to table the proposal until the July meeting in Reno, Nevada. He stated that each council member should go back to their Department and let his/her Membership know about the proposal to eliminate the Washington DC Trip for our Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen winners.

Know this, VFW National receives a donation of \$130,000 from Twisted X for this trip each year. Twisted X makes Leather Boots. So, National must come up with the difference of \$102,000. There are ways that National can get the money and I am also on the VFW National Budget & Finance Committee, so I see where the dollars are budgeted and spent.

It was also suggested that if each Department donated \$2,000 from the combination of all the Posts "Relief Fund", then National would have \$104,000 for the trip every year.

I would like each of you to give suggestions to your District Commander. District Commander's, please compile these suggestions and give the best 10 to me.

I also would like you to start writing letters to the National Officers that I mentioned above. If they start receiving letters from YOU, telling them to KEEP THE WASHINGTON DC TRIP in your own words, I think they will get the message.

Thank you again for allowing me to serve you as Your National Council of Administration Member representing the Department of Michigan. I want to end by thanking everyone who has contributed to my campaign fund so far, for National Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief 2023-2024. It is expensive! 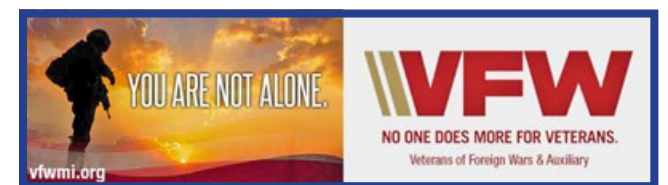
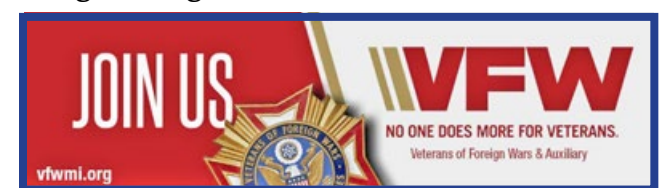

**ALL STATE DIRECTOR, NORM MAULDIN****REMEMBER TO GET YOUR FINAL ACTIVITY & HOSPITAL REPORTS IN BY APRIL 30TH**

The All State Program ends on April 30, 2020. ALL requirements must

be met and the checklist submitted to Department or myself by that time. If you have met all the requirements except for 100% membership, you will have until June 30th to reach 100%. Please review the spread sheet for accuracy and feel free to contact me at **248-767-3260** or unreper@mi.rr.com concerning any discrepancies. Good Luck to all in the running.

Provided everything goes as planned, we should have hats, pins, and certificates at convention for those who qualified by the deadline. If you are still working on your membership and had your checklist in by the deadline with at least 175 points, don't give up. Those who attain the membership requirements between May 1, 2020 and June

30, 2020 (the membership deadline), should receive their awards during Fall Conference (POW-WOW).

There will be a few changes to the All-State Program in the upcoming year. It will look more like past programs with the PTSD Program added in. There will be a maximum on the donations and the number of points required will be adjusted based on the maximum and minimum attainable. Please check the spreadsheet and the web page for information. 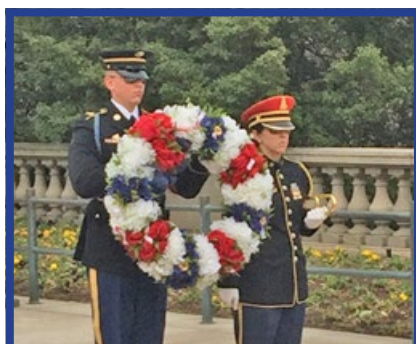

Commanders, when you took this job it came with responsibilities, get your own Posts to report and don't let a Post leave a District meeting without turning in a report if they are lacking. Please do not take this lightly. The Directors are reporting to the District Commanders, but it seems to stop there. In other words, do your job if you expect others to do theirs.

On a brighter note, like I said earlier there are some Posts that are doing outstanding. I know it can be a hard and thankless job, I've been there.

I would like to mention some of the mistakes being made on reporting:

- When reporting online, put all your reports in one entry. You shouldn't add a separate entry for each activity.
- Do not put abbreviations on the report, ex. Donated \$50.00 to the CYO, you might know what CYO stands for but it doesn't mean that I do.
- Please do not send in duplicate reports, I have some posts that are doing them online, emailing them to me and sending them to dept. It gets very confusing.
- The reporting dates are from the first of the month to the last of the month, NOT the tenth to the tenth.
- Cootie functions, VFW Riders, Auxiliary, District meetings, conventions etc. are NOT reportable.
- I have numerous posts that report that their Honor Guard did 6 funerals. Put down how many Comrades attended the funeral. Ex: Honor Guard did 6 funerals with a total of 36 members, 360 total miles and 72 total hours.
- Don't forget to put down the value of the hall when donating it. If your hall rents for \$300.00 to the public than that is what you put down as value for a hall donation.

I just touched on a few things but if you have any questions don't hesitate to get in touch with me, if you leave a message make sure that you leave your name and Post number.

As of February 28, we have 6,139 chartered Posts nationally. There are 16 less Posts since December. There are currently 33 Posts under suspension, four of which are new. Michigan is part of these suspensions statistics. Administrative operations are engaged in 30 Article IX disciplinary actions, 10 administrative actions and six membership eligibility challenges.

As of Wednesday, March 11, Michigan is in 17th place out of 52 Departments at 93.93%. National is at 92.71%. We have 35,061 members and we need 2,265 in order to reach our Goal of 100%. WE CAN DO IT!

Michigan is in 3rd place at in the Big Ten Conference. Minnesota is in 1st Place at 94.01%. Wisconsin is in 2nd Place at 93.97%. We are just .05% from being in 2nd place.

With everyone's help, Michigan will again be able to achieve 100% in membership by June 30th. Thank you everyone for all your hard work on membership. KEEP IT UP!

MICHIGAN VETERANS AFFAIRS DIRECTOR,
ZANETA ADAMS

The Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency is making major strides to connect more veterans to the benefits they earned for their service. Since I was appointed Director of the state agency in June 2019, we have made outreach to Michigan's 600,000 veterans and their families our top priority.

And our efforts appear to be paying off. Consider this: From October through February, our Veteran Resource Service Center handled 24% more cases of veterans seeking assistance than during the same five-month period from the year before. More importantly, the number of cases our staff referred to a Veteran Service Officer skyrocketed 262% during that period, strongly suggesting that hundreds more veterans were being connected to health care, education and other benefits.

Here are a few more of our successes in supporting veterans:

- In fiscal year 2019, the MVAA's five Veterans Service Officers submitted 1,136 applications for veterans looking to connect to benefits -- totaling nearly \$20 million in recoveries for veterans and eligible family members.

- We have reached more than 80,000 Vietnam veterans using the state Vietnam Veteran Coalition Appropriation made to our agency in 2019.

- We held more than a dozen "listening sessions" and recognition ceremonies for veterans around the state last year, connecting to hundreds of veterans.

We plan to keep that momentum going through a continued agenda of ambitious outreach this year and beyond. That includes facilitating veteran-centered events and increasing awareness through our 10 Regional Coordinators, who cover the entire state.

Another way we'll reach more veterans is through new and enhanced partnerships. Last year, for example, we welcomed the opportunity to build a partnership with the Bay Mills Indian Community in Brimley. I'm proud to say that State Veterans Affairs Offices can now accredit members of tribal organizations and that soon we will partner with the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians in Manistee as well.

As the central coordinating agency for Michigan's veterans and their families, we must break down silos and eliminate misconceptions while building stronger partnerships with all veteran-connected agencies and organizations. But we need your help to do this.

I believe that we are stronger together and owe it to our veterans to make sure they are supported.

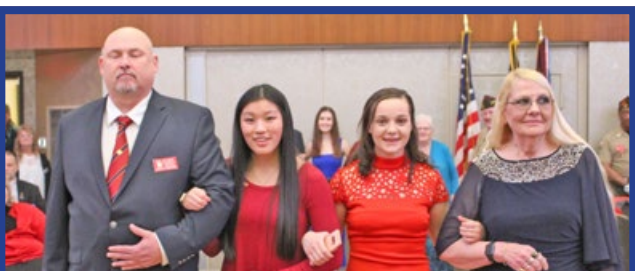

Post 2144 is always trying to lead the way in the 8th District and the Department and we are proud to have done it again.



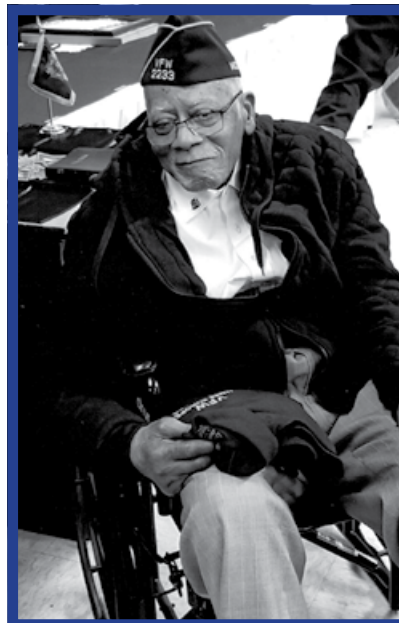
POST #2233 DETROIT
