"Cootie School"


For the 2021-2022 year; The Military Order of the Cootie ranks are 9,199 Cooties world-wide, with 284 Pup Tents. Membership, not only in the Cooties but in the VFW is very important to us. The VFW is our pool of qualified members. Cooties across the globe are "doing our part" by recruiting VFW members as well as Cooties. To date, 657 Cooties have recruited over 3,844 VFW members. One of our other missions is Hospital work. In this year, Cooties have visited over 79,053 patients, accumulating over 79,202 hours, covering 674,489 miles and donated over \$399,489.00 hard dollars to those efforts.

Our other mission is The VFW National Home for Children. This year Cooties have; donated \$16,000.00 for the Supreme Commander's Special Project- Purchasing Indoor/Outdoor sports activity equipment, purchased a 2nd Snow Plow vehicle (on order), and purchased a generator set for the Military Order of the Cootie House.

As we move forward this coming year, I am dedicated more than ever to travel this great state conducting workshops in Posts and Districts helping you and those who just might be in attendance contemplating taking their life. To those whom I spoke to directly afterwards my sincerest condolences to your losses, and I plan to hold some trainings to educate on those simple signs including getting those interested SAFE TALK trained. To close, I would like to share a poem that I found perhaps will give you HOPE when your lost or you know someone whose giving up and wants the pain to end.

I sit down and wonder how long since you left? Leaving me frozen, so lost and bereft






