# **Administrative Operations**

- There are currently 52 Posts under suspension, three of which are new. There were no processed Post consolidations pursuant to Section 209 of the National Bylaws. The organization has 5,654 chartered Posts.
- Administrative Operations is engaged in 17 Article IX Disciplinary Actions, 15 Administrative Removals/Actions and 15 membership eligibility challenges.
- Currently Administrative Operations has 82 Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions in for review, 17 of which are new; current turnaround time on Bylaws/Articles of Incorporation submissions is approximately 45-60 days.

## **Disciplinary Action Guide:**

There have been recent updates to the Disciplinary Action Guide that outlines the process to successfully complete a disciplinary action. We have included information to the guide that encompasses sentencing guidelines which is located as an appendix at the end of the guide and outlines sentencing/penalty considerations, clarifications, and examples.

The guide is available on the Document Repository in the "Guide to Disciplinary Action" folder or on the VFW website behind the login under My VFW/Bylaws: Training, Forms & Templates/Training Guides & Standard Operating Procedures.

#### **Department Inspections:**

As the Department Inspection initiative is well underway for the 2023-2024 term, we would like to share some of the common items that have been identified by the inspection team during their visits. We are halfway through the scheduled inspections for the year so the items below may change as we are able to gather more data. Please understand the list of items below is not allencompassing but are the most commonly identified concerns the team encounters during the inspections. Some of these items are considered deficiencies pursuant to the National Bylaws but some are simply issues that can assist a Department in their daily operations, if implemented.

## **Most Commonly Identified Concerns:**

- Failure to have proof of eligibility for all District Commanders, Senior Vice Commanders, and Junior Vice Commanders on file at the Department (Ref. Section 416).
- Departments are not properly bonded pursuant to Section 703 of the National Bylaws.
  - o Failing to ensure **all** officers accountable for funds are bonded.
  - o Departments not securing a bond that covers the required amount of all funds.
  - o Departments do not have VFW National listed as additional insureds.
- Lack of or incomplete and outdated Standard Operating Procedures (HQ's staff, Service Officers, and HQ's operations).
- Lack of defined Adjutant/Quartermaster duties specific to the Department.
  - o Lack of Employee Handbook.
- To include policies approved by the Department Council of Administration and signed by all employees and Department officers.
  - o Conflict of Interest
  - o Sexual Harassment
  - o Travel Policy
  - o Vehicle Use Policy
  - o Use of Credit Cards
  - o Code of Ethics
  - o Information Technology/Security

• The Department Council of Administration should be approving Budgets, SOPs, Policies, Employee Handbooks, etc., but are failing to maintain proper records or meeting minutes showing approval of these items.

#### **National Legislative Service**

• GI Bill Stifled by Overregulation: VFW National Legislative Service Deputy Director Kristina Keenan spoke on a legislative panel at the midwinter meeting of the National Association of State Approving Agencies. These agencies have responsibility to review,

approve, and monitor all programs and schools to ensure quality education for those using VA benefits such as the GI Bill. Keenan presented the VFW's concern that overregulation has caused too many schools to stop participating in the GI Bill program due to increasingly burdensome requirements. She also stressed the need for student veterans who take some or all college courses online to receive a more realistic monthly housing allowance, currently set at half the national average. The VFW supports increasing this amount to ensure that veterans do not experience housing insecurity while pursuing an education.

• Veteran Hearings in the House: The House Committee on Veterans' Affairs held four hearings on various issues facing veterans and one on VA itself. The full committee held an oversight hearing on reports of sexual harassment at VA. Subcommittee hearings included a deep dive into the VA Home Loans program, use of artificial intelligence, the Electronic Health Record upgrade, and VA's spending in compensation and pension programs. #### **National Veterans Service**

- NVS director attended meetings of the National Association of State Directors of Veterans Affairs (NASDVA) and participated in a roundtable discussion about Legislative and Veterans Benefits priorities and new initiatives in Crystal City, Virginia.
- NVS leadership met with representatives from the Veterans Health Group to discuss potential collaborations related to Social Security Disability Income (SSDI).
- VFW's NVS Pre-Discharge representatives briefed transitioning service members on VA benefits at Fort Campbell, Fort Bliss, Fort Meade, NSA Annapolis, and NSA Washington, D.C.
- NVS BDD leadership conducted a quarterly meeting with the National Capitol Region Pre-Discharge claims reps.
- NVS health team participated in the VA Advisory Committee for minority veterans.
- NVS health team participated in the VA VetResources Community Network session.
