DEPARTMENT COMMANDER, JOHN GRIFFITH

As we start a new VFW year, I've had a few thoughts I wanted to share with my Comrades and Sisters and Brothers of the Auxiliary.

To start off with I want to emphasize that I was not around in the 1920's or 1930's so I have to rely upon my history lesson from school and the wisdom my Father passed on to me. In the 1920's and 30's American Industrialists exploited the working men, women and even children by having them work 60 and 70 hour work weeks in unsafe conditions, resulting in many accidents and untimely deaths. Then along came Henry Ford and the unions. The work week was reduced to 40 hours, Safety standards were established and benefits were initiated. What had been normal began to change, and things got better.

In the 1940's to the mid 1960's, because of Jim Crow Laws and prejudice, minority Americans were subjected to discrimination and precluded from full participation in the American experiment. Even in the mist of WWII and the Korean War, uniformed minority service men and women were treated with disrespect, discriminated against and humiliated while trying to obtain a meal or lodging. Then along came Martin Luther King Jr., John & Robert Kennedy and men like Ralph David Abernathy Sr. and civil rights laws were enacted. What had been normal began to change, and things got better.

In the mid 1970's, our military desegregated the services allowing women to take their place alongside their male counterparts, opening up many military occupations that had been denied to women. What had been normal began to change, and things got better.

In the 1960 and 70's the conflict in Viet Nam grew politically unpopular in our society. Even some returning veterans from Viet Nam were shunned by some members and Posts of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) because "their war" wasn't a declared or "real" war. Until finally, our fellow veterans realized that the Viet Nam veterans were treated unfairly and they began to fill the ranks of VFW Posts throughout our organization. What had been normal began to change, and things got better. Now more that 65% of VFW membership is made up of Viet Nam Veterans.

While I hate to admit it we Vietnam veterans are now getting old and our ranks are rapidly thinning. So now we look to Post 9/11 warriors to fill our ranks and increase our VFW membership. We lament "we can't recruit these younger vets" and then when we are lucky enough to bring in some young blood, we don't welcome them, but, just as our WWII and Korean War Comrades initially shunned the Vietnam vets, some of our members are shunning our Post 9/11 veterans. I am hearing rumblings from various sectors within our Department that "these kids don't know how the VFW works", or "these boys and girls want to change the way the VFW does things".

THE ONLY ACTIVITY REPORTS THAT WILL BE ACCEPTED ARE THE ON-LINE REPORTING SYSTEM, NO EXCEPTIONS!

VFW Activity Reporting Instructions
Go to VFWMI.ORG webpage.

- Click on LOGIN, then click on Report Entry

- In the USERNAME put your Post Number (NUMBER ONLY)

- In PASSWORD put Pass13 then click on Login inside the black box.

- Go down to Add Report Data and click on Program Activity, then click on the ADD box all the way to the right.

Your Community Service report will come up. Change the month to the month for which you are reporting by clicking on the arrow in the month box and then fill in the "submitted by" portion and the report will open ready to fill out.

FLY AMERICAN FLAG at Post put number in the member's box.

FLY POW/MIA FLAG at Post put number in the Member's box.

MEMBERS THAT FLY THE AMERICAN FLAG at home put number of member's that fly American Flag at home in member's box, if higher than 10% of your total membership, proof must be given.

MEMBERS THAT FLY POW/MIS FLAG at home put number of member's that fly POW/MIA Flag at home in the member's box, again if higher than 10% of total membership proof must be given

POW/MIA TABLE at Post put a 1 in the member's box

Send or receive letters or have had contact with **LEGISLATORS** put number of letters/contacts that Post members have had contact with in member's box along with miles, hours and money spent.

DRUG LITERATURE distributed and/or available at Post for **YOUTH** put 1 in the

member's box.

SAFETY LITERATURE distributed and/or available at Post for **YOUTH** put 1 in member's box.

DRUG LITERATURE distributed and/or available at Post for **ADULTS** put 1 in the member's box.

SAFETY LITERATURE distributed and/or available at Post for **ADULTS** put 1 in the member's box.

If the post or members do any function related to drug and/or safety, make a separate report

ATTENDING OTHER VETERAN ORGANIZATION MEETINGS put number of Post members that attended meetings and total hour and miles traveled.

In order to **ADD MORE REPORTS**, click on the green dot on the blank line and a new line will be added. Just type in you event that you want to report. Remember to put number of members, total hours for all members and miles.

If you are **REPORTING A DONATION OF POST PROPERTY**, put in the dollar amount that you would rent your Post for a non-member.

If you are reporting **YOUTH ACTIVITIES**, put down what the activity is and then put how many members participated, total hours, miles traveled if any and report any money spent or value of hall etc. in the dollar column

- Before you hit the submit button, make sure you have everything listed. It is suggested that you **PRINT A COPY** of this report before you hit the submit button.

- Once you have entered everything, click the SUBMIT button.

This will take you back to the Member Access screen and you will be able to see the report you just entered under the Submitted Date.

Once the Activities Director approves the report it will disappear.

POST 334 - LAKE ORION

27 May, hundreds of volunteers showed up at Great Lakes National Cemetery (GLNC) to put out the American Flag on all of the plus 54,000 graves in time for Memorial Day. VFW Post 334 goes out the 3rd Tuesday each month and performs Honor Guard duty. Also during the year VFW Post 334 members go to GLNC for: twice annual headstone cleaning, placing out the Wreaths at Christmas, and attending the Memorial Day and Veteran Day ceremonies as well as picking up the American flags after Memorial Day. VFW Post 334 members also attended the Memorial Day ceremonies at Lakeville Cemetery, GLNC May 29 and the Orion

Veterans Memorial.

VFW Post 334 members Randy Stetson, Senior Vice Commander and Chuck Haskin, Quartermaster/Adjutant gave out almost 240 American flags on Saturday May 28th at the ACE Hardware store in Lake Orion.



Promoting Student Participation, Recipient Recognition, Community Awareness, and Increasing the Fund are the goals that will help achieve a successful Scholarship program.

The Voice of Democracy Contest is an audio essay contest for students in 9th-12th grades, who are asked to write an essay on the 2020 theme "Why is the Veteran Important?" Patriot's Pen is an essay contest for 6th-8th grades. The Theme is "My Pledge to our Veterans" These are VFW Programs that the Auxiliary helps support. Make sure you understand all the guidelines & forms needed - these can be found at: vfwmi.org or vfwauxmi.org

The deadlines are absolute & mean in the hands of the chairman NOT POSTMARKED. Student deadline to local Post is October 31, 2022. District deadline is November 15, 2022. Deadline is FINAL. Department deadline is December 7, 2020.

Please help to make sure all VOD & PP forms are filled out legibly and contain all the information asked for. It is important that Posts and Auxiliaries adhere to deadline dates and fill their portion of forms sent on to District and Department completely. Remember, if you can't read it - the person you send it to can't read it either. It would be a shame to have the possible winner disqualified because of penmanship and incomplete forms.

The VFW Auxiliary Continuing Education Scholarship, deadline of February 15, 2023, is open to members, their spouses, or children over the age of 18, providing financial assistance to further their education. The application includes an essay of no more than 300 words and is sent to National Headquarters. Four \$1,000.00 scholarships are awarded each year, one in each of the four VFW Auxiliary Conferences. Get the

word out early to Post Auxiliaries, meeting locations. The Application and complete guidelines can be found at:

vfwmi.org or vfwauxiliary.org

The premier scholarship of the VFW Auxiliary is The Young American Creative Patriotic Art Scholarship. It is open to students in grades 9th-12th (including Home schooled network). Students must be residents of Michigan and be sponsored by a Michigan Auxiliary. There are two separate contests this year with two separate prizes. One contest is two-dimensional art (painting - artwork on canvas and paper). The other contest is three-dimensional - pottery, art with wood, papier-mâché, etc. Applications and complete rules can be found at vfwmi.org or vfwauxiliary.org Student Deadline to the Local Auxiliary is March 31, 2023.

Promoting a donation to both Patriotic Art Escrow Funds will help these programs grow and reach more students. Encourage your Auxiliary to hold a fundraiser to increase both funds, the more youth we can recognize at the local, state, and National level, the more youth we serve.
