Since the founding of the Veterans of Foreign Wars by the Spanish American War veterans in 1899, our Comrades have fought through two World Wars, conflicts and wars in Vietnam, Korea, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan, Syria, Africa and a list of others around the

globe.

Together we survived the Flu Pandemic of 1919, the Great Depression, the Cold War, the attacks of 9/11, multiple recessions, and countless other global events. During those uncertain times, many Americans felt as though we might not make it through.

Rather than succumbing to these challenges, we came together as Comrades and we fought for the survival and the betterment of our Nation, our veterans and their families. The VFW helped create the Veterans Administration in 1930, along with the national cemetery system. Together we fought for our Comrades who were exposed to Agent Orange and other toxins in Vietnam. In 2008, we battled for the passage of the Post 9/11 Bill of Rights, alongside our friends at Student Veterans of America (SVA). Our efforts in passing Post 9/11 GI Bill helped to send over two million veterans and their family members to college, to a tune of over \$100 billion; forever changing the lives of Iraq and Afghanistan era veterans and their families, and ensuring our latest generation of warriors are placed on track to be the future leaders of our great Nation.

The first six months of this year of 2020 has brought with it the Covid-19 Pandemic. This "coronavirus" tipped off a series of economic and political events that will be studied by historians for decades and centuries to come. ... see page 2

DEPARTMENT COMMANDER CONTINUED ...

In addition to the public health concerns posed to many of our VFW and Auxiliary members, many of our Comrades have lost their jobs and the businesses they spent lifetimes in building. As these once in a century level events were occurring, Comrade Lynn Patterson was offered a new position, which left our Department without the Adjutant & Quartermaster who had served us honorably for the past five years.

Just as this crisis has shaken our economy, the financial viability of many of our Posts have been threatened, requiring us to be creative to ensure we do not lose any of our Posts due to unexpected financial issues thrust upon them. As a result of the Governor's "Stay at Home Orders" we were precluded from hosting our Department Convention. This dramatically altered the way in which our Department Officers are elected.

Rather than hosting elections at a Department Convention, as we have done every year since the VFW Department of Michigan's inception, we were directed by an Executive Order issued by VFW Headquarters and the Commander in-Chief that required myself as the Senior Vice Commander and Kevin Conklin as Junior Vice Commander, to move up in the chairs, and for all other officer positions to be vacated until the Council of Administration could hold a ballot vote, which was completed on 30 June 2020. The results of those elections are as follows: Junior Vice Commander: John Griffith; Quartermaster: Derek Blumke; Surgeon: Don Martindale; Chaplain: Jennifer Smith; Judge Advocate and Big Ten Delegate: Ray Lopez.

Compounding all of this, the way many of us interact with our loved ones, our dearest friends, and our Comrades have been altered, leaving many to feel isolated and alone; in a time when Comradeship is most needed.

This organization has survived for over 120 years. When posed with great challenges, we create greater opportunities. When told we cannot conduct business as usual, we began conducting video conferences and meetings from our computers. We've begun using email to conduct a great deal of our business, and have begun using computer software to keep better track of all the amazing work this organization does for veterans and their families everyday.

As we are sad at Comrade Patterson's

departure, we're excited for the future of this great organization. On 6 June 2020, I appointed Derek Blumke to be our Department Adjutant. Not long after, Derek was elected by the Council to also serve as our Department Quartermaster. In 2008, Derek founded Student Veterans of America (which has grown to over 1,500 chapters around the country). Last year he authored the resolution we passed at Department and then at National Convention to investigate the role of medications in causing the veteran suicide epidemic; while at the National Convention in Orlando, he also served as the keynote speaker at the National Memorial Service.

In every meeting we hold, together we say "Do not let petty jealousies or trivial personalities influence our deliberations. Let us uphold always the obligations of unselfish comradeship and loyalty to our organization and to the Government of the United States of America". In this same vein, we also must reflect on all of those with whom we have served and that just as in uniform, regardless of race, gender, age or persuasion, we are all Comrades and we must all fight for one another.

The theme of the VFW Department of Michigan is "Veterans Moving Forward". As we all know the past three months have been very trying times for us all, I ask you to call one another, do buddy checks, take care of one another and our Comrade's families. If you would like to have a Department officer to join you at an event with your District or Post, please let us know, as we want to be there for you in the most trying times, and in those of celebration. Congratulations go out to our new Department officers and those of the Auxiliary! It is my hope that together as we navigate these challenges, we remind ourselves of our dedication to this organization, our Comrades and their families. The year of 2020 will continue to pose challenges, but together, we will ensure the welfare and success of all of our Comrades.

I could not be prouder to be your Commander, and I will do everything in my power to support you, to ensure you and your Post thrives in the face of 2020, and in this most challenging of times, we are "Veterans Moving Forward", together.

A year ago, my friend Lauren Bowen -- Lauren lost her husband to suicide -- and I were given the opportunity to speak at Department C o n v e n t i o n about the role of

antidepressants in causing veteran suicides. A few months earlier, Graf-O’Hara Post 423, my home Post, passed a resolution I’d written that exposed dramatically higher suicide rates for veterans who use the VA for their care; and the role of antidepressants in causing suicides.

After our remarks, Lauren and I were supported with open arms. The resolution passed unanimously the next day. A week later, I was invited to serve as a keynote speaker at the VFW’s National Convention in Orlando. Again, I walked off stage and into the arms of veterans and widows with tears in their eyes and crushingly familiar stories. Here again, the resolution passed, making this issue a legislative priority of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

When Commander Gloger asked me to be his Adjutant, I said yes without hesitation, and I committed to give the VFW as much energy and compassion as I received from it in this past year. A month ago I was confirmed as the Department Adjutant and just a week ago, I was voted into the position of Quartermaster by the Council of Administration.

My path to the offices I now have the incredible honor of serving you in has not been a traditional one. Instead of going through the chairs, I learned the ropes of the veterans community as the founding national president of Student Veterans of America (SVA), and I learned business skills as a technology entrepreneur in New York City.

In 2008, I witnessed the incredible strength of the VFW, as I fought alongside you for the Passage of the Post 9/11 GI Bill. Fast forward to 2018, when I realized the medications the VA was prescribing me nearly killed me, and that this was happening to millions of other veterans and their family members. I returned to the VFW because I knew that if you knew something was wrong, our Comrades would want to do something about it, and I was right.

This organization is one of our Nation’s finest and most essential institutions. I am proud to be a part of the VFW, and to call you my Comrades. Thank you for this humbling opportunity, and for all of the incredible work we are going to do together for our veterans and their families in the next year.

Comrades, Sisters, and Brothers,

This has been a unique past few months for us due to the Coronavirus.

While the efforts to keep Posts (and Auxiliaries) viable using technology and misc. was rather encouraging, we know that there is still an existing trend of disconnection occurring regarding member involvement. As Past Dist. 6 Commander Neil Fulton once aptly paraphrased to me, '90% of the time, 10% of the people do 90% of the work.' This lack of participation is not just a Veterans of Foreign Wars' concern but a common problem in most business and social organizations. Specifically, it is found when a small number of dedicated stakeholders perform most of the output/work, often leading to burnout.

Indifference due to a variety of issues often results in diminished returns. Like a tangled string of Christmas lights with a few nonworking bulbs, the whole product is less

effective and sometimes rendered unusable (i.e. not enough workers to undertake tasks, etc.). So, the question is – What can we do to get members more involved and proactive?

Humbly, I suggest the following: Be clear about the mission and objectives, be pragmatic, and lead positively by example to motivate. The mission of the VFW is: "To foster camaraderie among United States veterans of overseas conflicts. To serve our veterans, the military, and our communities. To advocate on behalf of all veterans." Please also consider: What are your Post's specific goals? What are your reasonable plans to properly address any obstacles and to meet those objectives? Are you communicating effectively and encouraging ethical mentor/menteeship?

Moreover, we all have gifts to give, and these can vary from time and effort to money, etc. As 1 Corinthians 12:20-25 (ESV) states, "As it is, there are many parts, yet one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I have no need of you,' nor again the head to the feet, 'I have no need of you.' On the contrary, the

parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and on those parts of the body that we think less honorable we bestow the greater honor, and our unrepresentable parts are treated with greater modesty, which our more presentable parts do not require. But God has so composed the body, giving greater honor to the part that lacked it, that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another."

Last, even when a few lights go out on your light string, please do not despair, but remain active and dedicated to service; Positive results gain momentum and often yield more blessings to others. CAMP TROTTER DIRECTOR, BOB BENDERMAN

Have you ever wondered what roamed the grounds of Camp Trotter before it was happy children on warm summer days? Well me too! In preparation for my meeting with the Bill's Lake Association recently, I came across an article from 2018 written by Keasha Palmer.

In the article, Keasha talks about the stories her mother told her about growing up on a chicken farm. Her grandparents were Will & Edna Sproul and after working for the railroad, Will saw the potential trains had to safely transport live poultry all across the country. In the early 1900's the Sprouls founded Northland Farms where they hatched chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys on the banks of Bill's Lake in Newaygo, Michigan. The farm was highly successful, winning many awards and receiving the highest R.O.P (record of performance) year after year. For nearly 30 years, they shipped poultry to customers all over North America and to far-off provinces in northern Canada. Northland Farms also worked closely with what is now known as Michigan State University and other agricultural organizations to continuously improve the high quality of their layers. Unfortunately, the farm was no longer in production by the time Keasha was born in 1947 but she was able to find and visit the grounds in 2016 at the age of 69. She was expecting to find the land filled with new homes but was surprised to see many of the buildings she had seen in photos still standing. Today, the old chicken coops and hatcheries have been converted into camper housing and the former farm manager's house is now the summer home of our Camp Director.

This was an interesting story to find because we all know it as Camp Trotter with the land being donated to the Department of Michigan by WWII Veteran and past State Commander, Ralph Trotter. But this additional bit of history was unknown to me. What is still unknown to both myself and Keasha Palmer is what happened in the years between the operation of Northland Farms and the donation in 1949 by Comrade Trotter. **Do you know?**

POST 2645 - SOUTHFIELD

This Memorial Day was a special day for Dunham-Ray VFW Post 2645 Southfield. Post Commander Don Kuffner, Past Post Commander Al Stabrava, Adjutant/Quartermaster Jon Adams, Chaplain Lonnie Bennett, State Bugler Rudy Wade, Past District 5 President Donna Stabrava and Jerry Gorski, laid Memorial Day wreaths for Past Commander-in-Chief Eugene Ignatius Van Antwerp and Past Commander-in-Chief Carl Joseph Schoeninger at the Holy Sepulchre Cemetery in Southfield, Michigan.

These men were Charter Members and early Post Commanders of the Sixteenth Engineers VFW Post 582. The Post was named after the unit Captain Van Antwerp served in during World War I. The Post met at the GM Headquarter Building in Detroit, Michigan for a period of time. The Post was Chartered on December 19, 1920 and went defunct on February 18, 1981.

Then, our National Organization reissued the Post Number 582 to the Sherman-Wudarcki-Sutton VFW Post 582 in Ortonville, Michigan, District 5.

Captain Eugene Van Antwerp was born on July 26, 1889. He was educated in parochial

schools and then at the University of Detroit and worked as an instructor in English at Gonzaga University in 1910-1911.

In 1911, Eugene Van Antwerp married Mary Frances McDevitt. They had eleven children. They are buried next to each other at Holy Sepulcher Cemetery. Van Antwerp served as a Captain in the 16th Regiment of Engineers (Railway) from Detroit during World War I and was among the first members of the Allied Expeditionary Force to land in France. He served from 1917-1919. He served as the VFW National Commander of the Veterans of Foreign Wars from 1938-1939. He served a single term as the Mayor of Detroit from 1948-1950 and on the Council continuously until his death. He died on August 5, 1962 at the age of 72.

Carl Joseph Schoeninger was born on September 25, 1895 in Defiance, Ohio. He moved to Detroit in 1914 to work as an electrician for Detroit Edison. Carl served in the U.S. Army during World War I. After the War, he married Catherine Ellen Byrne in 1921 at the age of 25. Together they raised 6 daughters and a son. Carl became the City Electrical Inspector in 1924 and

was Chief Inspector before becoming Executive Secretary of the Detroit Electrical Contractors Association. Carl retired in 1955. The 16th Engineers was Michigan's only all volunteer Regiment during World War I. He served as Post Commander in 1927 and VFW State Commander in 1932. He also served as the VFW National Commander in 1943. In addition, he served as an Overseas Emissary for President Franklin D. Roosevelt during World War II. Carl passed away on June 28, 1980 at the age of 84 in Dearborn, Michigan.

Thank you National Sergeant Gary Gamble for doing the research on our Past Chiefs.



POST 3734 - FRUITPORT

We are urging all VFW & Auxiliary members to write their State Representatives and State Senators to ask them to pass legislation for eligible veterans to have one or two wars displayed on their license plates; including those with DV plate notation; at no cost to them. The current limit is one war; or none of the plate has DV on it. The cost to the state of Michigan would be minimal. Many Michigan veterans have served in both Iraq and Afghanistan and must choose between them. There is room for two wars and/or DM on a plate so this should be no problem. Urge you state legislator to support legislation to make this happen in 2020.

We are also urging all VFW & Auxiliary members to write President Donald Trump to call upon Russian President V. Putin to repatriate the remains of 23,000 some American POW's held by the Germans in World War II. They were taken by the Communist Russians when they overran German POW camps on the Eastern Front. These soldiers were written off by our government for many years and it is time to bring them home. Also, around 2,500 Korean War POW's ended up in Russia and never heard from again. Given the relatively good relations between President Putin and President Trump, this is a very good time to pass such a resolution by our Michigan legislature and send it with our membership letters to President Trump.

Two good books to read on this subject are: "Forsaken But Not Forgotten - American's Most Shameful National Secret Revealed" by Phillip Rife and "Washington's Secret Betrayal of American POW's In The Soviet Union - Soldiers of Misfortune" by James D Sanders, Mark A. Sauter, and R. Cort Kirkwood.

POST 9931 - BRIDGEPORT

VFW Post 9931 has partnered with Feeding America, a nationwide network of local food banks that feeds more than 40 million people through food pantries, shelters, and meal programs, Feed America helps provide people with nourishing meals, give kids the food they need when they need it most, especially during school closures; and provide balanced, nourishing meals for seniors.

As Veterans and community servants, we are all in this together, and together we can help distribution providers food to people who are most at-risk of facing hunger.

One of the pillars of Veterans of Foreign Wars of The United States of America is helping Veterans in need. Another is Community Involvement, if ever there was a time to demonstrate our organizational mission, that time is now.

The call went out from several local affiliate outlets. Due to the many closures, the need for food donations was going to be much greater than the usual monthly volunteer staff could handle. It went from volunteering at one distribution site to possibly setting one up at the Post in partnership with Resurrection Lutheran Church-Saginaw, MI; Hidden Harvest Food Pantry, Community Action Center, Buena Vista, MI

Items available range from frozen meats, pizza, fresh vegetables, and dairy products including milk and cheese. Dry Cereal, canned goods, bottled Apple Juice and Teas.

Many recipients show great appreciation as many are visiting the donation sites for the first time. The words like; "thank you" "we appreciate you all," "you're such a blessing" is heartfelt, but at the end of the day, it is our reasonable sacrifice.

At all sites we personal protection equipment such as cloth masks, hand sanitizers and gloves. The distributions take place no matter the weather. To date as of this writing, we have served over 600 families throughout Saginaw County. The food distributions take place on the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month @2115 Brockway Rd. Saginaw, MI. All are welcomed.

In addition to the food distribution project, we have been working in partnership with The Aleda E. Lutz VA Medical Center in Saginaw, MI providing bi-weekly provisions of food to the local known homeless veteran population.

MVAA Makes State Emergency Aid Available to Michigan Veterans

Struggling veterans in many counties across Michigan are able to put food on the table, make essential housing and vehicle repairs and pay medical bills thanks to the County Veteran Service Fund Emergency Relief (CVSF-ER) effort launched by the MVAA during the COVID-19 pandemic.

As the state's coordinating agency for Michigan's more than 550,000 veterans and their families, the MVAA facilitates \$6.4 million in CVSF state-appropriated grants to County Veterans Service Offices.

The emergency aid was made available to counties that were previously approved for CVSF grants but wanted to amend the grants to offer emergency relief directly to veterans. Some counties were slated to spend CVSF grants on veteran outreach and activities but were unable due to pandemic restrictions. The emergency relief was also available to counties that either did not qualify or chose not to apply for CVSF grants previously.

The emergency relief effort gained considerable traction, with at least 20 Michigan counties participating by mid-June to the tune of \$1.3 million. The CVSF-ER grants, determined by each county's veteran population, ranged from \$6,000 in Wexford County (with 2,500 veterans) to \$519,736 in Wayne County (with 83,400 veterans).

Eligible veterans from all eras – both wartime and peacetime – in participating counties can use the money to make home and vehicle repairs, pay medical expenses and meet other needs determined emergent. As part of the effort, the MVAA also teamed up with Meijer to provide grocery vouchers to veterans in participating counties.

While the emergency assistance is helping veterans hurt by the COVID-19 pandemic, it also applied to emergent needs stemming from the central Michigan flooding in May. Both Midland and Gladwin counties, which were devastated by flooding, applied for and were approved for CVSF-ER grants.

As Gov. Whitmer said in helping announce the CVSF-ER effort: "The State of Michigan is committed to supporting our veterans and their families during these challenging times and every day throughout the year. These brave men and women put their lives on the line to protect our freedoms and we will continue serving them as they served us."

Indeed, for those counties that opted in, veterans of all eras could take advantage of emergency funding opportunities while also becoming more familiar with resources that are available to them and their families. No matter which era they served in, they deserve support when they need it the most, especially during these trying and uncertain times.
