He has stepped up during tumultuous times to keep this great organization on track, and help keep it operating for the membership. That's why we voted to support him in his run for National Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief 2023-2024.

NATIONAL COUNCIL OF ADMINISTRATION, JERRY GORSKI

I just returned from Washington DC, where the National Council of Administration Workshop and National Council Committee Meetings were held. Because of the COVID Restrictions, we also did not have our Annual Legislative Conference Meetings with our Senators and Congressmen & Congresswomen. We also did not have the Department Voice of Democracy Winners and National Patriot's Pen Winner attend their Washington DC Trip along with the Parade of Winners. This is the 2nd Year in a row, where the Department Voice of Democracy Winners and National Patriot's Pen Winner Trip had been cancelled because of COVID.

While the National Council Members were in Washington DC, we got to see a live press conference held outside the U.S. Capitol Building with House Veterans Affairs Committee Chairman Mark Takono, who introduced and championed the "PACT Act", which stands for Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics, which will expand health care and benefits to all veterans with service-connected illnesses as a result of being exposed to toxic chemicals, environments and other hazards such as burn pits, during their war service. The Bill will cover veterans spanning generations.

At that Press Conference, we got to see Commander-in-Chief Fritz Mihelcic appear & speak along with other veteran service organizations regarding the "PACT Act, which is focused on assisting toxic-exposed veterans. Also appearing & speaking on behalf of the PACT Act were Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi, Members of Congress, advocates Jon Stewart and John Feal, and other VSOs to show their support for the bill. Also attending were members of the VFW.

Later in the afternoon, Commander-in-Chief Fritz Mihelcic testified in-person before the 117th Congress during a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Committees on Veteran Affairs, where he delivered the VFW Legislative Priorities Goals for 2022. Commander Fritz gave an impassioned answer about the PACT Act Bill, putting pressure on those who had not made their minds on which way to vote.

I am happy to report to you, that the PACT Act Bill PASSED in the House. Democrats, who unanimously voted for the bill, were joined by 34 Republicans in passing the legislation. It now goes to the Senate for Approval and then on to President Biden's desk for Signing into Law. It should be Passed & Signed into law by the time you read my article.

During President Biden's State of the Union Address before Congress, while we were in Washington DC, President Biden

asked legislators to address the issue. President Biden stated, "Pass a law to make sure veterans devastated by toxic exposures in Iraq and Afghanistan finally get the benefits and the comprehensive health care they serve".

Membership. As of March 12, 2022, Michigan is in 8th Place in the Nation at 95.39%. Michigan moved up from 10th Place since my last article. That is Great! We need 1,633 New, Reinstated and Continuous Members to Reach 100%. National is at 93.12%. National needs 71,224 New, Reinstated and Continuous Members to Reach 100%. Michigan is still in 1st Place in the Big Ten Conference at 95.39%. That is also Great! Missouri is in 2nd Place at 95.08%. WE CAN STAY IN 1ST PLACE in the Big Ten Conference with everyone's help. WE CAN DO IT! I KNOW WE CAN!

Thank you again for Electing Me as your National Council of Administration Member representing YOU and the Department of Michigan for 2019 through 2023.

Thank you again Michigan for Endorsing Me for National Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief 2023-2024 representing Michigan. I will not let you down!

Greetings, Comrades and Auxiliary Sisters and Brothers!



"THESE MAJESTIC HORSES HELP HEAL OUR WOUNDED WARRIORS"

With a boost, Rachael settled atop her beloved horse, Palette - and suddenly, all the pain and weariness of the past two years faded away. I feel alive again, Rachael thrilled, her heart filling with hope.

Things will get better, she realized. And she had just one thought: I wish I could share this feeling with others who are hurting.

FOUR-LEGGED THERAPY

From the time she was a child, horses had been Rachael's solace. Growing up, she spend countless hours at the farm across the road from her Goodrich, Michigan, home, helping care for and riding horses. At just 10, using saved birthday money, she bough her first horse. "Saba" became her best friend and confidant - especially when her mom remarried and her stepdad turned abusive. Eventually, her mom got the courage to leave, but all the turmoil had Rachael heading down the wrong path in high school. But through everything, Saba remained her anchor, and their bond helped Rachael get back on track.

After graduation, she studied equine management and science, and over the years, worked a variety of animal-related jobs. And every chance she had, she went riding with Saba and her foal, Palette.

Then in 2010, Rachel grew so weak that she could barely get out of bed. It took two years for her to be diagnosed with common variable immune deficiency, in which the body doesn't produce antibodies to bacteria and viruses. During the darkest days, the one thing that kept Rachael going was her horses. She'd struggle to the stable.

Being able to touch them and nuzzle their soft manes lifted her spirit as she came to terms with her illness.

Now filled with gratitude, she decided, *I'm going to build a place where wounded souls can experience the same healing love of horse.*

MAKING MIRACLES

In 2016, with her husband, Ted Gilmour, Rachel opened Equine Escape (equineescapeinc.org), welcoming special need, at-risk youth and wounded warriors.

"When I get anxious, I start holding my breath. But when I ride, I can feel my horse breathing, and I start breathing with her and I get calm," says Melissa Everett, an Army vet who suffers from bipolar disorder and PTSD.

Since returning home, Rick Young, a veteran who served in Iraq, had been stampeding his way through life, always pushing himself and others. But the draft horse he chose insisted on setting the pace. "I pushed and pulled. Nothing worked. I finally threw up my hands. Lesson acknowledged."

When Kent Thomas, who spent a year in Afghanistan, told Rachael he wasn't sleeping, she gave him a series of exercises. "Lean forward and let your body rest against the horse's neck," she began, then, "Turn around, lie on your back with your head toward her flanks."

"I had to trust and give myself over to the horse completely," Kent says. "When it was over, I climbed into my car and bawled like a baby. At home, I slept like a baby 14 hours straight. Now, whenever I start feeling

edgy, my wife tells me it's time to visit the horses."

"You don't realize how many issues you have until you get around a horse and feel comforted by them," says Stephanie G., a wounded warrior who now volunteers at Equine Escape.

Rick agrees. "My horse, Gretel, is a great listener and an even better friend," he says. Rachael smiles knowingly.

"You can't hide your feelings from a horse," she says. "And they don't care what you look like, where you come from or your financial status. Their unconditional love and acceptance heals hearts and souls."
