


SENIOR VICE COMMANDER

Any negligence on the part of the Trustees may make them an accessory to the act of any misuse of Post funds by reason of not performing their duties as prescribed in the By-Laws and in accordance with their obligation. The Bonding Company liability is contingent with the compliance of VFW By-Laws by Post Officers. Meaning if they can prove that the Post was not performing due diligence then they can deny the claim.

The VFW passed a resolution to amend Article XI, Sections 1101-1104 of our National Bylaws at the 116th National Convention in Pittsburgh,



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Advocating For Others

Many of us are familiar with the VA program that allows a veteran to apply for structural alterations to a house if modifications are needed due to service connected disabilities. These

alterations are usually approved for veterans who have suffered traumatic amputations or are blind or a combination of both. But what if a veteran suffered an accident after service that left him seriously disabled? Is he or she ineligible because the disability is not related to service? The answer is no, but there is a program that he or she is eligible for.

The VA has a program called Home Improvements and Structural Alterations (HISA). This is a grant program that allows for medically necessary home improvements to a veteran's primary residence. Alterations may include: entrances and exits from the home, bathroom and kitchen renovations, entryway or driveway improvements to ease access to the home to include construction of a ramp, and improvements to plumbing or electrical systems when needed due to the installation of medical equipment.

The grant does have limits with respect to dollar amounts. There is a lifetime limit of up to \$6,800 for those who have a service connected disability or a non-service connected condition rated 50 percent or more. For those veterans who do not meet those criteria a lifetime benefit of up to \$2,000 may be provided.

So, you believe you may qualify for the grant. What is the first step? The best option is to start with your primary care physician, preferably VA to ensure a smoother process. The physician must fill out a prescription that includes the specific items required, a medical diagnosis and justification for those items, and the veteran's name, address, social security number, and phone number.

Next is completing an application. This is done using VA Form 10-0103, VETERANS APPLICATION FOR ASSISTANCE In Acquiring Home Improvement and Structural Alterations. The applicant must also have quotes from at least three licensed contractors and include the contractors' name, address, telephone number, and Federal tax ID number or social security number. The veteran's name, address, and telephone number must be included as well. If the property to be renovated is rented or leased you must have written permission from the owner. The last requirement is a photograph of the work site prior to construction. To apply contact your local Prosthetic Service at the nearest VA medical center.

VA also provides grants to veterans with certain permanent and total service-connected disabilities to help purchase or construct an adapted home, or modify an existing home to accommodate a disability. Two grant programs exist: Specially Adapted Housing (SAH) grant and Special Housing Adaptation (SHA) grant.

In addition to the loss of limb or blindness referenced at the beginning of this article the VA also includes certain burn injuries and respiratory injuries. Like the HISA grant, the SAH and SHA have limits which are adjusted annually. No individual may use the grant benefit more than three times up to the maximum dollar amount allowable.

Membership was again the main topic at the 116th VFW National Convention this year. We heard from each of our National Officers speak about recruiting and retention of members. Today, we still have eligible Veterans from all Wars and all Conflicts, who do not belong to the Veterans of Foreign. Many eligible Veterans have never been asked to join the V.F.W. Yes, that's right, they have never been asked. Many eligible Veterans are returning home from Afghanistan. WE just need to ask these Young Veterans as well as ALL Veterans from ALL Wars and Conflicts to join the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Tell them about the VA Benefits and VA Healthcare, that they could be eligible to receive. Tell them about the "Best" V.F.W. Department of Michigan Service Office (Detroit) and the "Best" Service Officers throughout Michigan that will help them apply for VA Benefits. Don't be afraid to

ask any of these Veterans, where ever you see them. It could in a grocery store, at a restaurant, at a concert or even at a water aerobics class. Yes, a water aerobics class. I just signed up a New "Life" Member at my Friday water aerobics class, when I returned home from the VFW National Convention in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. I went back to resume my water aerobics classes. I met the Veteran a month ago at one of my Friday aerobics classes. He was wearing a U.S. Air Force cap, so I started talking to him and at the end of the conversation, I gave him an application. I kept asking him every Friday, when I saw him with his son. He said he didn't want to be an Annual Member but wanted to be a Life Member. So, he paid his Life Membership Fee with his American Express Card. Oh yes, he is joining my Post 2645 Southfield.

I also attended the Membership Training Class conducted by Director Bob Crider and Assistant Director Rick Butler. Rick Butler attended our Department Convention in June 2014 and conducted an excellent Membership Training Class on Sunday, following the Department Convention. 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Department Service Officers **SUCCESS STORY**

Clear and Unmistakable errors (CUE) occur when the VA fails to follow procedural directives, overlooked material facts of records, and/or failed to apply or incorrectly applied the laws or regulations in place at the time the claim was filed. There are occasions when these errors are not discovered until decades later.

Our service officer was reviewing the veteran's claim folder in preparation for an appellate hearing. While reviewing the military medical records an entry caught his eye. The veteran had suffered a serious gunshot wound during the Korean War and it quickly became apparent he had been seriously under evaluated. Additionally, the residuals of his gunshot wound were worse than his evaluation currently reflected. The service officer began to suspect the original rating for the gunshot wound was incorrect. The veteran was rated at 10 percent even though the muscle wound was through-and-through and severe. Upon further review of the veteran's service treatment records it was shown his gunshot wound required lengthy hospitalization, debridement of the muscle area, had become infected, and sustained weakness.

After a thorough review the service officer became certain the VA had erred in the original decision and submitted a claim for a CUE in regards to the original evaluation and for the residuals of the gunshot wound. According to the Code of Federal Regulations in effect at the time of the injury the severity warranted a much higher evaluation than a 10 percent rating.

During the subsequent hearing on a related issue the service officer was able to persuade the VA Decision Review Officer (DRO) to look into the matter of the CUE. As this was not normally a part of the appeal process he had to convince the DRO to take jurisdiction over the matter. It should be noted there are few rating officials who are trained or have the experience to deal with this kind of claim. The DRO's are raters with the highest level of experience and training and this certainly worked in our and the veteran's favor.

Upon review of the record the DRO agreed the VA had indeed committed a clear and unmistakable error. The DRO requested a Compensation & Pension examination so a VA physician could review the veteran's service medical records and formally describe the severity of the gunshot wound at the time it occurred. The DRO made the decision to retroactively increase the veteran from 10 percent to 40 percent disabled for the gunshot wound back to 1954. In addition, the veteran had filed for Total Disability Individual Unemployability (TDIU). This issue had been previously denied and warranted another look. The veteran was granted TDIU back to 2002 and his appeal for an increase for the residual effects of the wound was also granted retroactively.

This resulted in a retroactive payment of over \$421,000! Persistence, attention to detail, and teamwork once again were at the forefront of the VFW service office. Though late, this veteran received what he had been entitled to for the last 60 years.

Ladies iliary To Become The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary (VFW Auxiliary)!"

This may very well be some of the most important

information you will receive this year. At the recently completed National Convention in Pittsburg, PA, the Veterans of Foreign Wars voted overwhelmingly to change their By-Laws and allow the male relatives of veterans eligible to join the VFW into the Auxiliary. They also voted to change the name of the Auxiliary to The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States Auxiliary or VFW Auxiliary for short. This change will take effect 30 days after the convention so that means on August 21, 2015 we will begin accepting and voting on applications for

your male relatives to join your female relatives already in our auxiliaries.

To be clear the following relationships are now eligible: both parents, all siblings, all children (age 16 or older), all grandchildren (age 16 or older), and grandparents. If you are a veteran who is eligible for membership in the VFW, we need your help to get the word out to your relatives. Please contact your own local auxiliary or one nearby to sign up the newest members. We will need a DD214 for proof of their eligibility unless they are joining your own post's auxiliary. In that case we need the information on your service, but do not need to see a DD214.

This will be a learning process for all of us, so please be patient as the bugs are worked out in this new change of eligibility. Be ready to give us those members and we promise to put them make history, and show the Veterans of Foreign Wars that their decision was embraced by all of us.

county committees, dispenses grants to veterans and their families to relieve temporary, emergent financial crisis or hardship. The trustees represent the interests of the veterans community in both an advisory and advocacy role.

House Bill 4642 would amend the Veterans Trust Fund Act to do all of the following:

Regional Committees

The bill would eliminate references in the act to county and district committees and replace them with references to regional committees. The board of trustees of the Trust Fund would be required to establish up to 10 regional committees for administration of the allocated money on the local level by October 1, 2016, and be required to report to the Legislature the structure of the regional committees no later than August 1, 2016. Membership of these committees is described later in the summary.

Eligibility

The bill strikes current language regarding eligibility for benefits and replaces it by specifying that an individual who satisfies any of the following criteria would be eligible to apply for benefits from the Fund:

- Is both a resident of this state and a
- Is a resident of this state and is either an unremarried spouse or an unmarried dependent of a deceased individual who met all of the conditions set specified in the bill.
- · Is a resident of this state and is either an unremarried spouse or an unmarried dependent of a member of the armed forces of the United States who was killed in action or who is missing in action. The Michigan Department of Veterans of Foreign Wars is against this bill as written.



The Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency will again offer two Veteran Expos in 2015, where veterans can more easily learn more about resources and services available to them throughout the state. The first Veteran Expo will take place in Lansing in Sept. 11 and 12.

Throughout Michigan a variety of resources are available to veterans, but finding the right services spanning employment, education and health care can be difficult. At Michigan's Veteran Expos all these resources come together in one place, offering a convenient way to learn more about services, benefits and organizations at the federal, state and local levels.

Building on the success of last year's events, the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency is hosting another series of Veteran Expos in 2015 to help veterans and their families connect with resources and new opportunities across the state and within their local communities. The Department of Michigan Veterans of Foreign Wars will no longer be accepting Post Audits that are not properly completed. No credit will be given to the Post until the deficiency has been corrected.

If your Post Audit does not have all three Post Trustees signatures on the audit it will be returned to the Post. If a Trustee is not available to complete the audit we need a statement from the Trustee and Commander explaining why the Trustee was unable to complete and sign the audit.

The National By-Laws does not state that the Post Commander is allowed to appoint a Trustee (Pro Tem). If a Trustee is unable to fulfill their duties they should be removed from the position and a new Trustee be elected.

The Department Officers understand that this is a big change and we are willing to help in any way possible with this change. We are trying to see that, we, as a Department are meeting all requirements that the National By-Laws set before us.




VFW National Home for Children Fishing Contest




